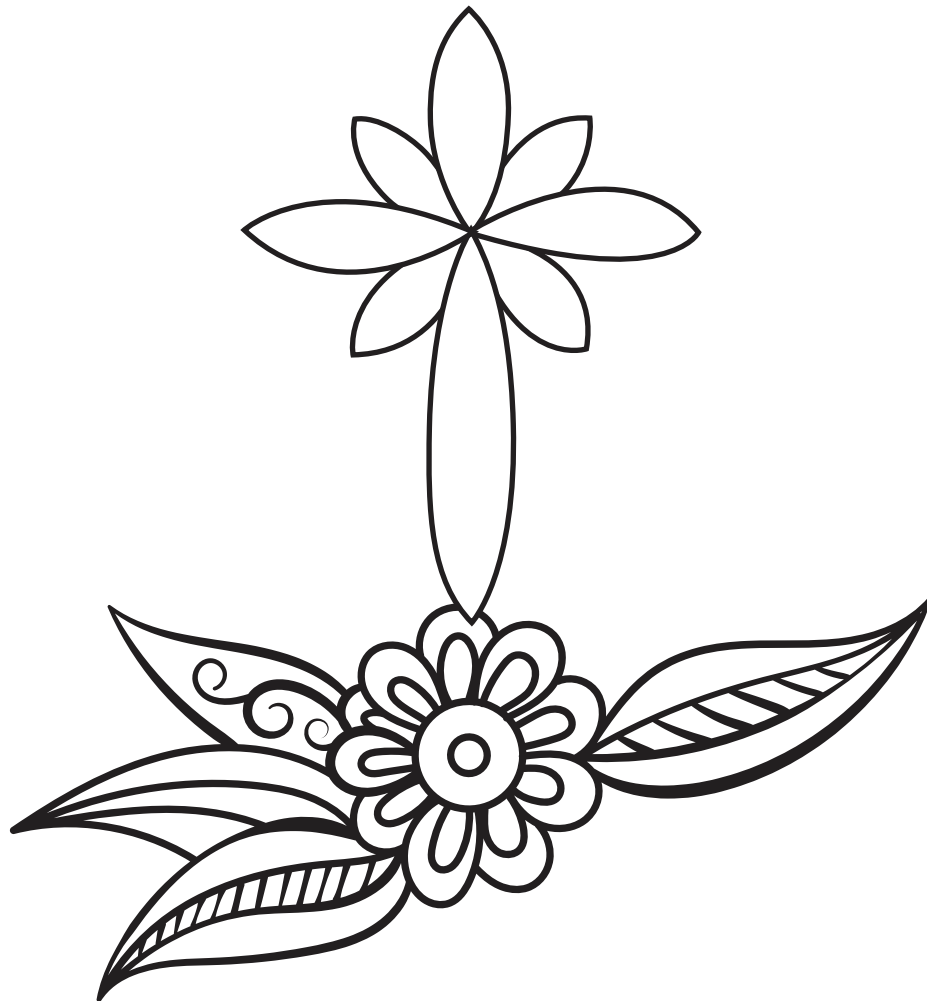

### *Tips & Suggestions*

Scripture coloring is even more useful when combined with a deeper Bible study practice. I recommend incorporating techniques such as verse mapping, Bible journaling, or Scripture writing, to help you understand each verse on a deeper level.

Coloring time can also be a great opportunity to pray and ponder the meaning of the Scripture, and ask God to show you how to live out His Word in your everyday life. Don't forget to talk to God during your coloring session!

Choose smooth, quality paper for the best coloring experience. Copy paper will work in a pinch, but a good inkjet or laser paper will be better. Look for paper with a smooth, bright white finish. When you get ready to print your coloring page, feel free to omit pages #1 and #2 of this document, as they're only here for your information. (The coloring page is page #3).



## ABOUT THE SYMBOLISM

*In this verse, the far-reaching effects of God's grace are made crystal clear. We're saved solely by grace, simply by having faith in His Son Jesus Christ! What an amazing truth!*

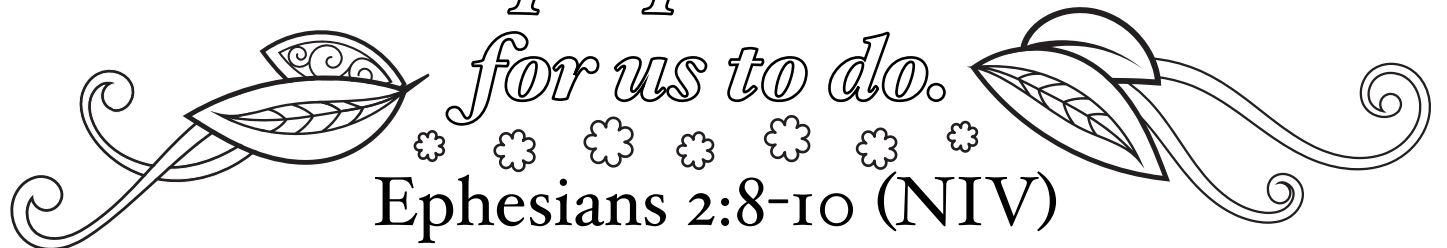
The scrollwork is symbolic of this far-reaching GRACE, while the crosses of course remind us of the sacrifice Jesus made to bring us such amazing grace.

For the verse itself, I chose to emphasize the words "grace" and "faith", because receiving that **free gift of grace** is dependent on **having faith in Christ**. Nothing more, nothing less.

While the scrollwork at the top of the page represent God's grace poured out to us, we can imagine that the scrolls at the the bottom represent us going out into the world to then "*do good works*".
